Environmental Report

As most of you know, the DLIA's environmental committee is responsible for maintaining the quality of Deer Lake within its shoreline border. Deer Lake Conservancy, our partner in the caretaking of Deer Lake, is responsible for improving and maintaining the quality of Deer Lake through the monitoring and restriction of any undesirable pollutants or contaminants flowing into the lake.

We are pleased to announce that we have applied for and received two grants from the Wisconsin DNR. The first grant is for the control of invasive Curly Leaf pondweed. This \$20,000 project is in the form of a 50/50 grant. The Wisconsin DNR will provide \$10,000 and the DLIA will expense \$10,000. We will be treating approximately 30 acres with one application being applied April 27. Last year the DNR would only let us treat 5 acres of the approximate 80 acres of pondweed in the lake. We are pleased to see this increasing cooperation with the DNR!

The second grant totals \$13,000 and is a very desirable 75% DNR/ 25% DLIA ratio! This grant is for the continuation of our "Clean boat- Clean water" Deer Lake program. This is in cooperation with the Town of St. Croix Falls as they are responsible for the caretaking of the boat landing including the removal and re-entry of the dock. This grant will cover the next two years. It provides for students that both volunteer and receive pay for working at the landing to educate and validate the removal of weeds from boats and trailers (most importantly to inspect boats, trailers and live wells before they enter our lake).

In addition to the above grants, we have been given the OK from the DNR for up to seven applications of CuSO₄ in the control of algae outbreaks. Each application costs roughly \$1,000. Your DLIA dues and additional \$50 tax assessment are hard at work maintaining the quality of our beautiful lake! On behalf of our entire DLIA organization, I would like to personally recognize and thank Dr. Mark Thayer, the president of our Environmental Committee. He has devoted countless hours in monitoring, collaborating with other experts, patiently working with the DNR, and negotiating contracts that made all of the above a reality. Deer Lake is very fortunate to have such a guardian. He does not wish to be recognized for his unselfish work. He will have to get over it.
