

#### **Environmental Committee Report**

As a sub-committee of the **Deer Lake Improvement Association**, our main objective is to improve and maintain the water quality of Deer Lake from shore to shore. The **Deer Lake Conservancy** improves the water quality of Deer Lake by reducing or restricting pollutants that flow into our lake. Our DLIA has three main on-going tasks from year to year and they are as follows:

- 1) **Curlyleaf Pondweed** (CLP) control. We have a 50% matching fund grant through 2014 up to \$39,000.00 for this treatment. This year, 7 sites covering 33 acres will be treated. This must be done before the water temperature reaches 60 degrees (CLP is growing then and vulnerable to chemical treatment but desirable plants are not vulnerable yet).
- 2) Filamentous algae control. As per the permit approved by the DNR, only surface algae may be treated. Any filamentous algae below the surface will not be permitted. Because copper sulfate is used to treat algae and copper can concentrate to a detrimental level if too much is added to the lake, the DNR strongly discourages treatment of algae. The existing copper concentration in Deer Lake is within safe limits at this time.
- 3) Clean Boats and Clean Water program. We have a grant from the DNR for this program also. In years past, we have been very fortunate to have Dr. Mark Thayer essentially draft, coordinate and arrange for the staffing of personnel at the boat landing. Hired staff at the landing would monitor and educate boat owners both incoming and outgoing on the proper checklist regarding the possible transportation of invasive species. Regrettably, Dr. Thayer can no longer continue in this capacity. We are all deeply indebted to all of his work on this project and are currently looking for a replacement. If any of you have an interest in helping with this program, please contact us!

We are proud to boast that our lake is, locally, without equal in water clarity and purity and wish you all a great summer enjoying this wonderful natural treasure!


If you haven't had a chance or have forgotten please visit our web-site. There is a schedule on there in case there are last minute changes to events.

### **Neil McKenzie Youth Fishing Derby**




