This is a very informative meeting with informational handouts and the opportunity to meet other residents on the lake.

Lake directories will be distributed at this time, please come and get one or arrange to have someone pick it up for you.

Environmental Report:

Zebra Mussels

We still have not found any additional zebra mussels in the lake since the September, 2016 sighting. However, we want to continue to the search so if they are present in the lake, we find them before they spread throughout the lake.

You should have received an email with instruction on how to search your shoreline. Also in the email was a table for you to log the time spent on these inspections. We will receive a \$12 credit against our grant for every volunteer hour - but only if you fill out the time log and return it at the end of the season.

We also will be completing a veliger tow in July. A veliger is the zebra mussel larvae. Water samples will be taken at several locations throughout the lake and analyzed for zebra mussel veliger. This was completed last summer as well and the results came back negative.

Other Invasive Species Concerns

Yellow Iris -

There is yellow iris on the shore line of several Deer Lake properties. Yellow iris can produce many seeds that can float from the plant and spread throughout the lake shore. Once established it forms dense clumps or floating mats that can alter wildlife habitat and species diversity. It is recommended that small populations be removed by physical methods. Care should be taken if hand-pulling as some people show skin sensitivity to plant sap and tissues. All parts of the plant should be dug out and disposed of in a landfill or by burning.



Japanese Knotweed -

This plant is also present on Deer Lake. It can grow to 10 feet tall and poses a significant threat to shoreline areas where it prevents tree regeneration and increases soil erosion. Hand pulling is recommended to try and remove as much of the rhizomes as possible. Properly dispose of plant debris.

- •Parade begins at 1:00 pm and will be going counterclockwise this year.


Grab a flag, put it on your boat and participate in the parade! By being in the parade you can see how everyone on the lake celebrates the Fourth.

Fireworks



This Summer's Fireworks display will be Tuesday July 3rd with a storm date of Saturday July 7th. The workers will be setting up the display all day on the 3rd at the McBride's dock on the east side of Hungerford Point.

In the interest of safety please maintain at least a 500 foot distance from the area of set up. Also, please be aware that large wakes add significantly to the difficulty and danger in setting up the display.

We ask that you avoid the area when wakeboarding, tubing, jet skiing, and water skiing. Large wakes travel great distances so please show some courtesy to the guys setting up.

During the show it is imperative that a 500 foot distance from the fireworks barge be maintained at all times. A missed shot can easily travel this distance. And lastly, as a courtesy to other boaters please shut your docking lights off when watching the show. Not only are they annoying, it is also illegal to operate a boat with docking lights on other than to approach or leave a dock. They are not headlights.

If there is questionable weather please check the web page, facebook or your email for the status of the fireworks!



Please join us July 4th and August 11th at 7:00 pm on the leeward side of Hungerford Point for another season of Music on the Lake.

The Good Foot Express will fire up on the 4th and are sure to keep you entertained. The Undergroove is back by popular demand for the August 11th show.

Both bands will keep you dancing and singing along with a variety of tunes you know and love.

Please be considerate of the Band and keep high wake activities such as wakeboarding, tubing, or jet skiing confined to a different part of the Lake. Also, as you approach and depart the area of the concert please keep your wake to a minimum. Large waves travel great distances and wreak havoc with the Band.

So load up your crew, grab your favorite beverage, and head on out for another Deer Lake tradition.

And don't forget your dancing shoes.



The busiest weekend of the Summer is coming; July 4th weekend. Please remember to review all boating rules and respect others on the lake by following those rules.


Jet-skis and people water-skiing/ tubing must be 100 feet apart!



NO WAKE zones

- 200 feet from shoreline
- 100 feet off another boat
- 100 feet off a dock, pier or raft

So be careful as you near other boaters the shoreline, docks, piers and rafts be sure to reduce your speed.

Deer Lake Tales— A Look Back at Deer Lake:

Lagoon Chicken Salad

- 2 whole broiler-fryer chicken breasts, halved, boned, skinned
- 1 1/2 c unsweetened apple juice
- 3 c cooked wild rice, prepared according to package directions
- 1 1/2 c seedless green grapes halved
- 1 c chopped unpeeled apple
- 1/2 c chopped celery
- 3/4 c slivered almonds, divided
- 1/2 c chopped water chestnuts

For Dressing:

1 c mayonnaise 1/2 tsp seasoned salt 1/4 tsp cinnamon Spinach leaves

In deep saucepan, place chicken; add apple juice and cook over medium

heat about 15 minutes or until fork can be inserted in chicken with ease. Remove chicken from pan, reserve broth for other use, if desired.

Dice Chicken and chill. Gently toss together chicken, wild rice, grapes, apple, celery, 1/2 c of the slivered almonds and water chestnuts. Mix the mayonnaise, seasoned salt and cinnamon. Add the mayonnaise dressing to the chicken mixture and toss lightly. Cover and chill about 30 minutes to blend flavors.

To serve, place spinach leaves on platter, spoon chicken mixture on top, and sprinkle with remaining 1/4 c of the slivered almonds.

Makes 4 servings.
