## Info on the Cell Tower Proposal:

Some homeowners on Maple Cove and Peer Avenue received a notice concerning a "Conditional Use Permit Application / SBA Towers, V, LLC, Verizon Wireless / New Wireless Multi-tenant Communication Tower Facility."

The long and the short of it is that SBA Towers and Verizon have proposed a project that calls for the construction of a cell tower at the NW corner of the intersection of Hwy 35 and Hwy 8 off of Peer Ave, this will be an unmanned tower and communications facility. The site is located in the woods so it will limit the visual impact of the compound area of the tower. The tower will have lights but will be medium to low intensity lights that are white during the day and red at The lights will be designed to shine upward as to not shine on the ground and provide better viewing for air navigation (so much for star gazing). The tower will not be painted but will be galvanized in color so that it will blend in with the sky.

The town of St. Croix Falls Planning commission met on June 11th at 6 pm to review the land use aspects regarding construction and hours of traffic associated with operations. There will be another meeting on June 18th at 9:30 am at the Polk County Government Center. While the law allows very few options in the opposition of the tower, a strong showing may be helpful in placing some restrictions on design criteria.



#### **Environmental Committee Report**

I'm sure some of you have noticed those funny looking "bags" anchored at various places around the lake. These are the markers that Lake Management placed after treating our lake for Curlyleaf Pondweed (CLP). Most if not all of these markers should now be gone. We have enjoyed a tremendous reduction in CLP as detailed in our year end 2013 analysis report. It will be interesting to see how the year-end report looks this year.

Some of you may have received some mailings of solicitations concerning a service offered involving scuba divers extracting weeds from the root system and immediately bagging and hauling them from the job site. All of this is done without chemicals and is allowed by the WI DNR. The DLIA is not anti small business. We do not want to be in a position to tell our members what they should do or not do. However, we on the environmental committee are admittedly biased towards keeping our lake as healthy and protected as possible. Our respectable response to this weed pulling service is as follows:

- 1) The pulling of native weeds from the lake bed will be disruptive to the soil and allow otherwise inactive phosphates, copper particles, and other deleterious chemicals to be re-introduced to the lake. This may allow algae blooms and more fertilizer drifting around to increase weed growth.
- 2) The removal of native plants is a "window of opportunity" for invasive species of plants to gain a foothold. This is why the DNR prohibits chemical treatment of plants. Our native Deer Lake plants are working 24/7 to displace and prevent the introduction of invasive plants. We on the environmental committee view our native plants to be good stewards of the lake and fish!


