Fireworks

Please join us for the annual Deer Lake fireworks display Saturday, July 2nd, at 10pm (the storm date will be Sunday, July 3rd).



Please, Please, be respectful of the crew setting up the display. The area in front of McBride's dock on the east side of Hungerford Point is a No Wake Zone for the entire day and night. Large boat waves wreak havoc with the setup process and greatly increase the risk to workers. For one day a year it would be nice if people would avoid this area and use a different part of our large lake.

Also please maintain a Safe Zone of 500 feet from the Setup Area and also from the Display Site during the show. Static electricity from a passing boat can cause premature detonation of the fireworks.

Please take the time to inform all that will be operating watercraft of these very important rules and requests and to familiarize yourselves with these areas of activity.

On July 3rd, place lanterns/lights on your dock by 10 pm, grab the family, and go for a late night cruise clockwise around the lake. Or, sit on your dock and watch the flickering lights around you. Usually the lake is lit from just before 10 till about 11 – enough time to go around the lake!



LED lights are suggested or a non-flammable light source if leaving for an evening boat ride. If you are sitting on the dock and using lanterns or candles, have a steady flat surface and glass containing the flame.




Be sure to grab your candle/lantern/LED lamp before going inside to bed.

Basic Boating Rules

Safety comes first on Deer Lake, so let's be courteous of all the boaters so we can have a safe and fun time. Two easy Wisconsin boating rules to remember, the 100 Foot Rule and the 200 Foot Rule.

• The 100 Foot Rule: While operating a motorboat, Slow-No-Wake speed is required when within 100 feet and when within 100 feet of any other boat, including are aware of these rules! other PWCs.

• The 200 Foot Rule: While operating any (PWC) Personal Watercraft, Slow-No-Wake speed is required when within 200 feet of the shoreline.

• Slow-No-Wake: Moving as slow as possible while still maintaining steerage (control of boats direction).


